NEWS FROM THE ENVIRONMENTAL COMMITTEE

ELECTRO FISH SCHEDULED- Washington County called to inform us that the DEC will be conducting an Electro Fish on the evenings of July 11th and 12th. The DEC will be using the Park and we will see bright lights on the water during this activity. There is no need to be alarmed or to call the County or officials. The DEC conducts an Electro Fish approximately every 10 years.

What is an Electro Fish? Electrofishing is a common technique used by fisheries biologists to sample fish populations in bodies of freshwater. As the name implies, electrofishing uses electricity to catch fish. Fisheries managers use this method to learn details about fish populations such as species composition, age distribution, and presence of invasive species.

Lawn fertilizing – applying lawn fertilizer to turf adjacent to the lake is NOT recommended. The fertilizer that makes the grass grow also makes aquatic weeds grow when it runs off or leaches into the water. Please do NOT fertilize your lawn.

Speaking of fertilizer - water fowl droppings also are a source of nutrients for the weeds, and can be a health hazard as well as a nuisance. It will lead to swimmer's itch"- a parasite infecting bathers. We realize that we will always have a small population here at the lake but we don't want to bring in any more. Therefore, please do not feed the ducks and please advise your guests and tenants of this, as well.

DECISIONS - DECISIONS - DECISIONS -

Our Super 50/50 raffle tickets have been printed. The membership voted to continue this fund raiser at the annual meeting, last August. At that time, it was suggested we lower the price of the ticket to \$50/ticket. This means we must sell 400 tickets to yield the \$20,000 that would be split with the winner. Hence, if you purchased a ticket last year for \$100, this year for the same \$100, you would get two tickets doubling the chance to win the raffle. It is incumbent of all of us to make this a successful fundraiser, if we are to continue to treat the lake.

We should remember what the lake looked like last year and what the lake looks like now after the SONAR treatment. We are in jeopardy of not being able to continue treating the lake without the necessary monies to pay for it. We can't even think about bringing a hydro-rake on the lake at this time due to the expense.

This should be an easy fundraiser. Remember whether we sell individual or multiple person tickets we need to sell 400 tickets and that means we need everyone's assistance to get this done. This should be an "opportunity" to support our mission while having a 1/up to 400 chance to win up to \$10,000. These odds are better than any scratcher, or lottery ticket. If we do not support this endeavor it is not likely that we will be able to sustain treating the lake and School House Pond and or hydro-raking. A hand full of persons cannot do this alone.

Please contact Gail Pfister to secure tickets to sell. The Super 50/50 raffle drawing will be held on August 12, 2017 at our Potluck Annual Meeting to be held at the lake Lauderdale County Park Pavilion.

Again, if we can't get people to pay \$15/per person it is not likely that we can increase membership to \$50 and up to cover costs. We are still updating our membership roster.
