NEWS FROM THE ENVIRONMENTAL COMMITTEE

Lawn fertilizing – applying lawn fertilizer to turf adjacent to the lake is NOT recommended. The fertilizer that makes the grass grow also makes aquatic weeds grow when it runs off or leaches into the water. Please do NOT fertilize your lawn.

Speaking of fertilizer - water fowl droppings also are a source of nutrients for the weeds, and can be a health hazard as well as a nuisance. It will lead to swimmer's itch"- a parasite infecting bathers. We realize that we will always have a small population here at the lake but we don't want to bring in any more. Therefore, please do not feed the ducks and please advise your guests and tenants of this, as well.

One of the fundamental purposes of the association is to maintain the quality of the lake. The major threat to the lake is invasive species, principal among which is milfoil. Invasive species can be re-introduced into a body of water by attachment to watercraft that have not been washed after being in another lake where milfoil exists. The control of milfoil involves treating the lake and pond with Sonar in accordance with a permit we apply for from the State. The cost has historically been approximately \$35,000 and treatment typically needs to be done every 3 years. Grants are generally not available. To offset the cost of the treatment, the association sponsors several fundraising efforts each year, the major one being the "Super50/50 Raffle", the goal of which is to yield approximately \$10,000 or one-third of the triennial cost of treatment. In 2016 the shortfall in revenue was accomplished by a request for a voluntary contribution of \$150 from property owners abutting the lake and pond. We anticipate that the lake and pond will require treatment in 2019.

2019 will be a SONAR treatment year; providing we have the funds



REMEMBER THIS?

We should remember what the lake looked like in 2016 and what the lake looks like now after the SONAR treatment. We are in jeopardy of not being able to continue treating the lake without the necessary monies to pay for it. We can't even think about bringing a hydro-rake on the lake at this time due to the expense.

SUPER 50/50 DRAWING

This should be an easy fundraiser. Remember whether we sell individual or multiple person tickets we need to sell 400 tickets and that means we need everyone's assistance to get this done. This should be an "opportunity" to support our mission while having a 1/up to 400 chance to win up to \$10,000. These odds are better than any scratcher, or lottery ticket. IF we do not support this endeavor it is not likely that we will be able to sustain treating the lake and School House Pond and or hydro-raking. It is incumbent of all of us to make this a successful fundraiser, if we are to continue to treat the lake. A hand full of persons cannot do this alone.

The Super 50/50 drawing will be held on Sunday, August 12 at the Annual Meeting. We need everyone's assistance to sell all 400 tickets. Remember multi-person tickets may be purchased/sold! We must remain vigilant to our mission of keeping Lake Lauderdale pristine. Help us to keep our costs down. A ticket form is attached. If you submit form and money we can send ticket or scan it and send to you or the person(s) who purchased. Consider sending the opportunity to your email and Facebook friends.
