- Thank you to everyone who participated in our Flotilla Raffles this summer. We raised \$382.50 in July and \$389.50 in September. The Super 50/50 raised \$3,700 which is over a thousand dollars less than last year and almost two thousand dollars less than 2021. We need to sell way more tickets for the 2024 Super 50/50. You can request blank tickets to sell starting now!
- We need someone to lead our Ways and Means Committee. Please consider volunteering for this important role because fund raising is the only way we survive.
- Thank you to everyone who supported last season's Sonar treatment it's not too late to contribute now! The application is still providing great results. There is no visible Eurasian Milfoil in the lake or pond. All of the weeds you see are healthy indigenous species.
- Water Chestnuts are unaffected by Sonar and still a major concern. We have unfortunately
 found many more water chestnut plants, this time at the southern end of the lake. Dan Wiley
 filled a five gallon bucket with all of the plants he pulled. If you think you see any sign of them,
 tell someone on the LLIA Board immediately.
- Applying lawn fertilizer to turf adjacent to the lake is not recommended. The fertilizer that
 makes the grass grow also makes aquatic weeds grow faster when it leaches into the
 water. Speaking of fertilizer water fowl droppings also are a source of nutrients for the weeds,
 We realize that we will always have a small population here at the lake, but we don't want to
 encourage them. Therefore, please do not feed the ducks and please advise your guests and
 tenants of this, as well.
